

## Media Release for Free and Reduced-Price Meals Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

East Austin College Prep (EAPrep) announced today that it will continue its policy to operate the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Program under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program for the 2016-2017 school year. All East Austin College Prep schools qualify to operate CEP and will serve breakfast and lunch to all children at no charge and eliminate the collection of meal applications for free, reduced-price, and paid student meals. This new approach reduces burdens for both families and school administrators and helps ensure that students receive nutritious meals.
